Genesis 1:1 In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. 2 The earth was formless and void, and darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was moving over the surface of the waters. NASU Any teaching about creation must speak of the truth that the Father , Son, and Holy Spirit were involved in creation. 'Elohiym (el-o-heem') the united one created the heavens and the earth. JMC

John 1:1-4 "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was in the beginning with God. 3 All things came into being through Him, and apart from Him nothing came into being that has come into being." NASU God who lives outside of time and space created time and space and all things that exist.

His creative power was manifested through His Son, Jesus Christ. Everything came into existence through Jesus who has eternally been with God and He, the Word, is God. So any group that seeks to be a good steward of creation must lift up and honor Jesus Christ. JMC

John 1:14-18 And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth. 15 John testified about Him and cried out, saying, "This was He of whom I said, ' He who comes after me has a higher rank than I, for <u>He existed before me</u>." 16 For of His fullness we have all received, and grace upon grace. 17 For the Law was given through Moses; grace and truth were realized through Jesus Christ. 18 No one has seen God at any time; the <u>only begotten God</u> who is in the bosom of the Father, He has explained Him. NASU John 1:18 No one has ever seen God; but the only and unique Son, who is identical with God and is at the Father's side — He has made Him known. Complete Jewish Bible

John 17:5 "Now, Father, glorify Me together with Yourself, with the glory which I had with You <u>before the world was</u>." NASU It is obvious from Scripture that Jesus existed before His incarnation and was sent by the Father to earth where He became the atoning sacrifice for man's sin. JMC

Hebrews 10:4-10 For it is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins. 5 Therefore, when He comes into the world, He says, "Sacrifice and offering You have not desired, <u>but a body You have prepared for Me</u>; 6 in whole burnt offerings and sacrifices for sin You have taken no pleasure. 7 "Then I said, 'behold, I have come (in the scroll of the book it is written of Me) to do Your will, O God."

8 After saying above, "Sacrifices and offerings and whole burnt offerings and sacrifices for sin You have not desired, nor have You taken pleasure in them" (which are offered according to the Law), 9 then He said, "behold, I have come to do Your will." He takes away the first in order to establish the second. 10 By this will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all. NASU

Jesus existed with the Father before He came into the world. Paul says in **Philippians 2** that Jesus existed in the form of God and was equal with God. Then in **Hebrews 10** we learn that as Jesus comes into the world He willingly empties Himself and "enters the body prepared for Him" thus taking on the form of man in order to fulfill the eternal plans of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit to deliver or redeem mankind from the consequences of sin by becoming the atoning sacrifice for the sins of the world. The body the "Word" entered became the perfect sacrifice to bring about forgiveness of our sins and restore a right relationship with our Father in Heaven. JMC

Philippians 2:5-9 Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, 6 who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped (that is held onto), 7 but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men. 8 Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled

Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. NASU

Hebrews 1:1-3 God, after He spoke long ago to the fathers in the prophets in many portions and in many ways, 2 in these last days has spoken to us in His Son, whom He appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made the world. 3 And He is the radiance of His glory and the exact representation of His nature, and upholds all things by the word of His power. NASU Jesus also upholds or sustains all that He created by His power packed word. JMC

Psalm 24:1 The earth is the Lord's, and all it contains, The world, and those who dwell in it. NASU

God created everything therefore everything belongs to Him. If I were to design and then create or produce a car it would rightfully belong to me. This is also true of God. JMC

Everything belongs to the Lord and everything should bring to Him as creator honor and glory. JMC

As God's stewards of the earth we honor and glorify Him by protecting and rehabilitating all eco systems. JMC

Psalm 19:1-4 The heavens declare the glory of God; And the firmament shows His handiwork. 2 Day unto day utters speech, And night unto night reveals knowledge.

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[And let them rule.] The relation of man to the creature is now stated. It is that of sovereignty. Those capacities of right thinking, right willing, and right acting, or of knowledge, holiness, and righteousness, in which man resembles God, gualify him for dominion, and constitute him lord of all creatures that are destitute of intellectual and moral endowments. Hence, wherever man enters he makes his sway to be felt. He contemplates the objects around him, marks their qualities and relations, conceives and resolves upon the end to be attained, and endeavors to make all reach together things within his work for its accomplishment. This is to rule on a limited scale. The field of his dominion is "the fish of the sea, the fowl of the skies, the cattle, the whole land, and everything that creepeth on the land." The order here is from the lowest to the highest. The fish, the fowl, are beneath the domestic cattle. These again are of less importance than the land, which man tills and renders fruitful in all that can gratify his appetite or his taste. The last and greatest victory of all is over the wild animals, which are included under the class of creepers that are prone in their posture, and move in a creeping attitude over the land. The primeval and prominent objects of human sway are here brought forward after the manner of Scripture. But there is not an object within the ken of man

which he does not aim at making subservient to his purposes. He has made the sea his highway to the ends of the earth, the stars his pilots on the pathless ocean, the sun his bleacher and painter, the bowels of the earth the treasury from which he draws his precious and useful metals and much of his fuel, the steam his motive power, and the lightning his messenger. These are proofs of the ever growing sway of man."

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I would say that there is a divine mandate inferred in Genesis 1 for humans to be the stewards for God of His creation. I might add that one of the foundation blocks of being His stewards must be a belief that God exists and is Creator. JMC

Psalm 115:16 The heavens are the heavens of the Lord, But the earth He has given to the sons of men. NASU.

Psalm 89:11 The heavens are Yours, the earth also is Yours; The world and all it contains, You have founded them. 12 The north and the south, You have created them; Tabor and Hermon shout for joy at Your name. NASU

It is our duty as Christians to help our offspring see the power and beauty and love of God by directing them to see the design and order of creation. JMC

Romans 8:19 For the anxious longing of the creation waits eagerly for the revealing of the sons of God. 20 For the

creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of Him who subjected it, in hope 21 that the creation itself also will be set free from its slavery to corruption into the freedom of the glory of the children of God. 22 For we know that the whole creation groans and suffers the pains of childbirth together until now. NASU

The true time of restoration will come when the sons of God are revealed. Creation will groan until then. So, we must always remember that there is a certain futility this side of Christ's coming to any and all efforts to restore to order the many things in creation that have been corrupted by man and his sinful behavior. JMC

Beyond even the second coming the new heaven and the new earth will only come into existence after Jesus has reigned on earth for 1,000 years; after satan rises against Jesus from the abyss at the end of Christ's 1,000 year reign; and he, satan, is found to be impotent and thrown into the lake of fire; and after the final judgment of mankind takes place. JMC

We must always recognize that "the heavens will pass away with a roar and the elements will be destroyed with intense heat, and the earth and its works will be burned up" (2 Peter 3:10) before all things are restored to God's perfect order. JMC

Romans 1:18-23 For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men who suppress the truth in unrighteousness, 19

because that which is known about God is evident within them; for God made it evident to them. 20 For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes, **His eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly seen, being understood through what has been made**, so that they are without excuse. 21 For even though they knew God, they did not honor Him as God or give thanks, but they became futile in their speculations, and their foolish heart was darkened. 22 Professing to be wise, they became fools, 23 and exchanged the glory of the incorruptible God for an image in the form of corruptible man and of birds and four-footed animals and crawling creatures. NASU

"And the one also who had received the one talent came up and said, 'Master, I knew you to be a hard man, reaping where you did not sow and gathering where you scattered no *seed*. And I was afraid, and went away and hid your talent in the ground. See, you have what is yours.'

"But his master answered and said to him, 'You wicked, lazy slave, you knew that I reap where I did not sow and gather where I scattered no *seed*. Then you ought to have put my money in the bank, and on my arrival I would have received my *money* back with interest. Therefore take away the talent from him, and give it to the one who has the ten talents.'

"For to everyone who has, *more* shall be given, and he will have an abundance; but from the one who does not have, even what he does have shall be taken away. Throw out the worthless slave into the outer darkness; in that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.
